Keep the school year the same

What should we do to improve our schools? Some say we should go to school more days each year. Students in the United States currently spend about 180 days in school every year. I think we should keep it that way. If we want to improve our schools, we should improve the quality of the time spent in the classroom, not the quantity.

First of all, students won't do better in school just because they spend more days in class. Researchers examined the average scores of schools in Maryland on a standardized test. They wanted to see if schools where many students attend every day got higher test scores than schools where fewer students attend every day. They found this wasn't the case. They couldn't prove that being in school more days makes students do better on tests.

Second, increasing the number of school days would hurt schools. Many schools are already struggling to pay for all the things they need. Professor Gene Glass of Arizona State University said that increasing the school year by 20 days cold cost the nation an extra \$ 40 billion every year. It would be very difficult to pay for extra days in school without putting kids in bigger classes and cutting programs like sports, art, and music. Adding days to the school year would make schools worse, not better.

Instead of making the school year longer, we should use time better in school. Teachers have to use class time to discipline students, hand out papers, and take attendance. One study found that students are participating in learning activities only about 40 percent of the time they are in class. That means in a 150minute class, students spend as little as 20 minutes learning! We don't need to increase the amount of time students spend in school. We need to cut the number of tasks teachers have to do. Then, students will spend more time learning, without having to spend more time in school.
